### About RISE 2022

- All virtual event
- Will be held on Thursday, April 14, 2022
- Create a virtual presentation to be shared with peers, staff, faculty, judges, and family and friends
- Day of, live video conversations during two, two-hour long sessions:
  - 10 AM ET 12:00 PM ET
  - 2:00 PM 4:00 PM ET
- Projects will only be presented at one of these two live sessions. You don't need to sign up for two.



### What Can Be Presented at RISE?

- Projects worked on/completed during the last year, from April 15 of 2021 onward.
- First-year students, please no projects conducted during high school.
- Research, creative endeavor broadly. Ceck out our website to see wide range of what what presented.
- On-campus and off-campus, on co-op, through internships, or simply on your own. (Just check with mentors that it is okay to present your work at RISE.)
- Projects don't need to be complete, you can share what you have done thus far.
- Can submit up to two abstract submissions BUT if you submit two abstracts, you must select two different presentation times.
  - If you can only make one time slot, pick the project you most want to present and submit one abstract.

## **Getting Started**

- To present at RISE, you need to submit a brief abstract for review.
- Abstracts are due March 7.
- If approved, we'll share our Presentation Template and a link to our Presentation gallery. You'll create your presentation, upload it to the gallery, and get ready to share your work during live Q&A. Don't worry, we'll share instructions.



## What's an Abstract?

- A brief summary of your project, no more than 100-words.
- Written for an educated, but non-specialist audience.
  - Question: Tells us what question or challenge you were trying to understand, explore, investigate.
  - **Significance:** Shares with us why this matters or should matter within your area of inquiry and to those who are NOT experts in your field.
  - **Methods and Conclusions:** Gives us some insight into what you did and what you learned.
- This is very brief you are trying to get folks excited.
- Write in plain English and be sure to proofread.

Don't include title in abstract (separate field for it).
No references, tables, citations, or acknowledgements.
A SINGLE PARAGRAPH.




## **Submitting Your Abstract**


Register on abstract system using your official Northeastern University email. The system will send a confirmation email to that address. Confirm and begin.


- Only one abstract per project.
- You can only submit two abstracts as an individual.
  - If submit two abstracts, must present projects in different sessions.
  - If you can only make one session, only submit one abstract.
- Do NOT list faculty members, post-docs as project presenters/members – there is a separate section for a primary mentor information.

You'll need following information about your and your project members:


- Remember, only students can be presenters


## **Primary Mentor Information**

This is where you share information on the person who is considered the primary mentor of your project.

#### You'll need to share:

- Their location at Northeastern, elsewhere, or they do not exist (very rare)
- We'll want to know their name, email, department or institutional affiliation.
- Do not include titles or honorifics in your entry such as Professor, etc. Simply list their first and last names.
- You can acknowledge additional mentors during your presentation – we are not collecting it in the abstract submission form.

## **Project Information**

Here you'll tell us, in brief, about your project.


- Category: What RISE category is it in? There are seven. Pick the one you think it falls under.
- **Title:** No more than 15 words. Please use Modern Language Association capitalization.

This means all principal words (nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, and some conjunctions) are capitalized. Do not capitalize articles (a, an, the), the coordinating conjunctions (and, but, or, nor, for, so, yet), or the words to and as **unless** such a word is the first or last word in the title or subtitle.

· Abstract: 100 words or less.

In order to present at RISE, we need to ensure that your project was conducted according to the highest ethical standards. For this reason, we ask that you confirm information related to IRB, IACUC, and Intellectual Property.

- If your projects involves Human Subjects, you will need to share the IRB approval number with us.
- If your subject involves the use of Vertebrate Animals, you will need to share the project's IACUC approval number with us.
- If your project involves novel inventions, we will ask you to share an invention number with us.


## Pick Your Presentation Time Slot
