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


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
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### **GENERAL APPLICATION CYCLE TIMELINE**

# 2026 Cycle Workshops

### Application Readiness Program

- Applicants can start preparing for their application cycle by joining the PreMed and PreHealth Advising Application Readiness Program during their application year.
- This entails completing a Self-Assessment survey in MAP, which encourages applicants to reflect on academic and experiential preparation for their designated health profession program, including the development of a Mock Application.
- After completing the Self-Assessment, applicants will be invited to schedule an Application Readiness Meeting (ARM) with their PreHealth Advisor. This 45-minute one-on-one appointment is designed to review and provide feedback on the Self-Assessment, guiding applicants toward developing a competitive application.

#### APPLICATION READINESS PROGRAM TIMELINE

- **February 1**: <u>First-time applicant</u> priority deadline to complete the Self-Assessment (early access to book your Application Readiness Meeting).
- March 1: <u>First-time applicant</u> final deadline to complete the Self-Assessment.
- **April 1**: <u>Re-applicant\*</u> deadline to complete the Self-Assessment.
- June 1: Deadline to complete required Application Readiness Meeting with your individual PreMed/PreHealth Advisor.

\*Note: The Application Readiness Program (Self-Assessment & Application Readiness Meeting) is an included and required part of the Letter Packet process.

## **NU Self-Assessment**

The Northeastern PreMed and PreHealth Advising Program's Self-Assessment, available in the <u>Medical Applicant Portal</u>, enables applicants to assess their readiness to apply to health professional schools by identifying and addressing key components of a competitive application.

Completing the Self-Assessment by the deadline below will enable you to participate in the Northeastern University PreMed and PreHealth Advising Program's Application Readiness Program and, if appliable, Letter Packet process.

- **February 1**: <u>First-time applicant</u> priority deadline to complete the Self-Assessment.
- March 1: <u>First-time applicant</u> final deadline to complete the Self-Assessment.
- April 1: <u>Re-applicant</u> deadline to complete the Self-Assessment.

Please be aware that the Self-Assessment includes several required components and **cannot be completed in one sitting**. We recommend setting aside multiple 2–3-hour sessions to ensure you can complete it thoroughly. Respondents can exit the survey and re-enter to finish it later from the same computer.

The more time and effort you invest in your self-assessment, the better prepared you'll be for your Application Readiness Meeting! The <u>Self-Assessment Workshop</u> will offer a comprehensive review of all components to help you ensure a timely and well-crafted submission.

Additionally, some elements of the Self-Assessment, including templates for the Mock Application, will be introduced and reviewed at our upcoming <u>Personal Statement</u> and <u>Work & Activities</u> Workshops.

Committing to the Self-Assessment process will allow you to receive valuable feedback, helping to strengthen and enhance your application!

### \*Note: The Application Readiness Program (Self-Assessment & Application Readiness Meeting) is an included and required part of the Letter Packet process.




### Letters of Evaluation: Letter Options for NU Applicants

- Letter Packet: A letter packet is a collection of letters of recommendation that is assembled and sent to schools as part of your application. These packets are typically compiled by a pre-health advising office at your undergraduate institution and can vary in format and content. The university PreMed and PreHealth Advising Program offers a Letter Packet service for students and alumni applying to medical, dental, and podiatry programs who are applying within three years of graduation or completion of their pre-medical studies. A NU Letter Packet includes all evaluations requested via your <u>Medical</u> <u>Applicant Portal</u>, plus an institutional cover sheet from the PreMed and PreHealth Advising Program. The PreMed and PreHealth Advising Program's institutional cover sheet provides context to your academic and experiential preparation.
- Individual Letters: When you're applying with individual letters, it means you're submitting separate letters of recommendation from different individuals rather than using a letter packet. If you are applying for admission to programs of **optometry**, **physician assistant**, **or veterinary** it is required that you apply with individual letters of evaluation. If you are an **Alumni who graduated three or more years ago**, individual letters are strongly preferred.

# Letter Packet



May 1: **SUBMISSION** deadline for **all** letters of evaluation in MAP

#### What's included:

- **Cover sheet**: The PreMed and PreHealth 1. Advising Program's institutional cover sheet provides context to your academic and experiential preparation. For NU undergraduate students and alumni, this includes information about Northeastern's Cooperative Education program, Global Pathways programs, unique aspects of our curriculum (I.e., our single-semester general chemistry course), and more. For students and alumni of the Northeastern University Pre-Medical Studies, Post-Baccalaureate Undergraduate Certificate program this includes program details and requirements.
- 2. THREE internal faculty letters of evaluation are required.
- **3. ONE** external clinical letter of evaluation is required.
- 4. Up to two additional external letters of evaluation are optional.

# Additional Letter Packet Requirements

To be completed in your application year. Requirements and deadlines are subject to change.

- February 1: <u>First-time applicant priority deadline to complete the Self-Assessment (early access to book your Application Readiness Meeting).</u>
- March 1: First-time applicant final deadline to complete the Self-Assessment
- March 1: First-time applicant deadline to request all required letters of evaluation in MAP
- April 1: <u>Re-applicant\*</u> deadline to complete the Self-Assessment.
- April 1: <u>Re-applicant\*</u> deadline to request all NEW and/or UPDATED external letters of evaluation in MAP
- May 1: Submission deadline for all letters of evaluation in MAP
- June 1: Deadline to complete required Application Readiness Meeting with your individual PreMed/PreHealth Advisor
- June 1: Deadline to take the MCAT/DAT. Scores must be released to NU
- July 1: Deadline to SUBMIT primary application
- July 1: Deadline to complete MAP
- July 1: Deadline to request Letter Packet

\*Re-applicant refers to Northeastern University students and alumni who have already completed the PreMed/PreHealth Letter Process for a previous cycle and are requesting a Letter Packet to re-apply to their programs.



### APPLY WHEN YOU ARE READY

• A successful applicant is one who waits until they are the strongest applicant before applying, even if that means taking one or more gap years!

### PRIORITIZE ENTANCE EXAMS

- It is recommended you study between 4-6 months, following completion of recommended coursework.
- If you are retaking your entrance exam, ensure you are not planning these in quick succession.
- Wait until practice scores match or exceed your goal score before testing!
