Massachusetts Dental Assistant License- On the Job Trained

Four Steps:

- BLS (Basic Life Saving) Certification
- Completion of CDC Guidelines for Infection Control in the Dental Healthcare Setting
- Completion of Board-approved Dental Radiology course OR passing score on DANB radiation health and safety exam
 - If you are not radiology certified, please upload a "Will Not Expose Radiograph" attestation signed by your supervising Dentist, which states that you will not take radiographs until the completion of a BORID-approved radiology course.
- Passing score of 75% or higher on dental assistant ethics and jurisprudence exam

Category Requirements

On the Job Trained (OJT)

- Proof of current certification in Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers (BLS)
- Proof of successful completion of a Board-approved radiation health and safety course OR proof of a passing score on the DANB radiation health and safety exam
 If an applicant is unable to provide proof of acceptable radiation health and safety training, then the applicant must provide a letter, signed by the applicant and dentist employer, that
- states the applicant will not take radiographs until the applicant completes this training
- Proof of successful completion of a continuing education course on the CDC Guidelines for Infection Control in the Dental Healthcare Setting
- Passing score of 75% or higher on the dental assistant ethics and jurisprudence exam

Here's how I did it:

1. Radiology Course:

 - Day 1: 8 hour zoom course covering all of the information. Information is presented in the form of a slideshow and practice test questions are provided and reviewed.
 - Mine was a Thursday 8am-4pm with an hour lunch break
 - Day 2: Approximately four hour in person taking x ray, mounting x rays, and taking a multiple choice test
 - 7:30am-11:30am or 9am-1pm on a Saturday or Sunday

- Notes:

- For step 8 you must get a CORI (Criminal Offender Record Information) form notarized. The form is provided on the website in step 8 of the process. I filled it out and then made an appointment with my bank to get the document notarized.
- My license got approved in about 2 weeks, but can take upwards to a month or more, so do not wait until the last minute.
